Dorothy Meyer; Presbyterian Day School in Christo Rey Belize

"Funding for the school comes locally from tuition, two local church donors and school fundraisers. These funds are sufficient for the running of the school: electricity, supplies, lawn care, bus etc. Funding for teachers' salaries comes from out-of-country donors. Donors from Canada send their donations to EduDeo. Donors from the U.S. send their donations to The Belize Project or via check through the mail. Six years ago, when EduDeo agreed to help fund Presbyterian Day School,

they indicated an amount that would decrease each year for five years, and then funding would stop. The plan was that P.D.S. would increase local funding each year until we were self-sufficient. That didn't happen. So EduDeo agreed to fund us one more year. The amount does not cover teachers' salaries completely, so each month we struggle to find enough funding.”
